### We're united to protect our contract and our standards

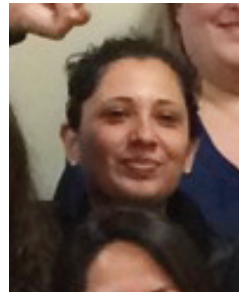

There is always uncertainty when an out-of-state, for-profit system comes into our community. In order to save our hospital we need to ensure that workers are willing to stay at Trios and that we can attract new staff to come work at our hospital.

Last week we were negotiations with RCCH to come to agreement on a new contract. They came with what they say is their last, best and final offer and say we must have a deal now that they can take to the bankruptcy. But the bankruptcy judge won't approve the bankruptcy plan until June. Even the creditor's committee hasn't approved the terms of the bankruptcy plan and our union serves on that committee. We're standing up for our patients, community, and workplace standards. Come to our meetings and find out about our plan to protect our hospital so that our community can trust they will receive quality care at our hospital and we can take care of our families.
