We are picketing for dignity, respect, safe staffing and a standard of care our community needs and deserves. Join us on November 20 on the picket line. Only together can we hold Astria accountable and call on them to prioritize patient care.

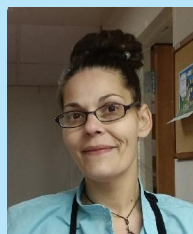
### Join us for a picket sign-making party the night before!
