We're turning it up at Swedish-Providence as we get ready to take public action in an informational picket next week on August 22.

We've never been so united. Thousands of us have voted to take public action to send a message to management that we won't tolerate putting less and less into patient care while paying executives millions. By wearing stickers, holding signs, and signing up to picket we are voicing our concerns and telling Swedish-Providence what we are united for.

We are continuing to stay strong and united as we grow our strength at Swedish-Providence. On Wednesday, August 7, we gave management our notice to picket. Management says they know what it takes to recruit and retain staff, but that's not reflected in their wage proposal. We know that a total of 7% over 4 years is not a livable wage increase—this is wrong. Our next bargaining is on September 5, which gives management an opportunity to do the right thing by their employees and patients. We are telling Swedish-Providence they cannot lead the way from behind!
