At our first bargaining session after our powerful strike action last week, we continued to make progress, but we were disappointed that management did not move on our key issues.

New Tentative Agreements

- Defining all of the jobs in the bargaining unit
- Defining PRNs
- Rest Between Shift: We want to be sure that everyone receives adequate rest between shift even when on-call.

Our next Bargaining date is **June 15.**
