The U.S. Secretary of Labor invited us to share our stories

Workers are striking for safety at Cascade. We know that it is by speaking with our united voice as workers that our demands will finally be heard and Cascade will have no choice but to make our workplace safe. Now, our united voice has now been heard all the way in Washington, D.C.!

U.S. Secretary of Labor Marty Walsh held a Zoom meeting with our coworkers and members of our bargaining team to hear about the unsafe working conditions at Cascade, the impact on patient care and our hopes for a safe workplace. We shared with Secretary Walsh how Acadia Healthcare has fostered an abnormally unsafe work environment, with severe understaffing, decrepit facilities, a shocking lack of COVID-19 protections, and



workplace violence. We believe that he heard our voices loud and clear and understands what we are fighting for.

We have never been more united for the safe workplace we need for our patients and community. We will continue to stand up for our patients, and in solidarity we will tell the world that we matter, and our patients matter. We're standing up for all of us!

"I was injured in the incident that happened August 1, which forced us to strike for our safety. I have been traumatized. I feel like my coworkers and I have been abandoned. Cascade isn't safe place to work anymore because management has failed to create a safe work environment, and because law enforcement refuses to come to the hospital when we call for their help."
