- A supermajority of us at Lincoln Hospital signed our unity petition! We delivered it to management the second week of October.
- We had historically high turnout to our proposal votes in September.
- ★ Workers are consistently joining with other co-workers and signing member cards.
- ★ We wore stickers on October 27 demanding "Lincoln Hospital Invest in Your Staff!"
- ★ We came closer to an agreement in our bargaining session on October 27. We bargain again on November 9. Please talk to your bargaining team member about next steps!

## **Your Rights at Work**

Can I wear a union button, sticker, or union insignia?

You have the right to wear buttons, stickers, lanyards, apparel and any other items related to our union or any actions we're taking together. If management tells you to take off a sticker, button, lanyard, etc., please notify a union delegate or organizer immediately.
