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
We are Voting to Take Public Action for Our Patients and Our Community!

Our bargaining team has been working hard to move management to do the right thing for us and our patients. We saw some movement last week from PHHCSC at the bargaining table, and we're getting closer to an agreement that respects our work. But we're still not close enough to offer competitive wages and management continues to leave some of us behind. We are voting to authorize our negotiating team to call for public action, including an informational picket. We need administration to do the right thing - it's time to take our campaign for a fair contract to our community!
