We won't tolerate retaliation from management!

Threatening one of us threatens all of us.

When we stand together, UWMC-NW is better. Each of our voices adds to the richness and strength of our workplace.

For management to retaliate against one of us for raising workplace concerns is unacceptable. We are united with our coworkers and we are responding swiftly and decisively. We are demanding a public apology from each member of management involved in these retaliatory actions immediately.

We marched on our CNO, the highest level Administrator here on the Northwest campus, demanding an immediate public apology. It violates labor laws when management retaliates against a worker for union activity. We expect UW Medicine to rectify this situation immediately, including a full public apology all members of management who have retaliated against our union members. We are prepared to take further action, including exploring legal options, to ensure we are treated with the respect we deserve.





"I and all of us in diagnostic imaging were absolutely shocked by this retaliation and we will not let it stand. We are even more shocked and disgusted that this was targeted at our coworker in EVS, one of the lowest paid and most exploited departments.
