# Our story of union strength

Nurses first joined our union in the early 1990s, followed by the first-ever group of imaging and diagnostic techs in our union. Airlift Northwest and many other job classes joined in the early 2000s and 2010s, creating one of the largest and strongest chapters in SEIU Healthcare 1199NW!

As workers at the only Trauma 1 hospital in the Pacific Northwest – the hospital that will always serve anyone, no matter their ability to pay - we have always had a strong dedication to our community and our patients. Forming and joining together in our union provided the outlet to channel that passion into better working conditions and better patient care.

#### Wages

Our wages have reliably and steadily grown:



"In the last wage reopener, I got the highest raise of my career. It never would have happened if we were in a union by ourselves. I'm so proud that we've set the standard for social work wages in the UW system, and that is the SEIU Healthcare 1199NW union difference. My kids are in college and I can support them now. The raises I've gotten have changed my life. Because we have a strong, fighting union, I am grossing more than \$2,000 more a month than I was making in January 2022. All social workers deserve this and it only happened because of our union and our unity. I really feel like I am being paid my worth and for the first time in my life, I really feel valued." #### **Groundbreaking wins**

We were the first hospital in our union to win and implement Break Relief nurses, and workers across job classes have made gains in staffing and in safety.

- We helped save the Harborview clinics from closure.
- We've won historic wage increases for all job classes with every contract.
- Access to paid administrative leave during the worst periods of COVID.
- Limitations on mandatory call and double-time pay for extra shifts.

 Strong Labor Management Committees where we can address issues quickly and directly with management.

We have proven that when we stick together and take action, we can lead the way in setting standards that all healthcare workers need and deserve!
