We are standing strong in our values of quality patient care and safe staffing. On August 8, our bargaining team leaders were featured in an article on the front page of the Everett Herald.



FROM THE ARTICLE:

“Since the joint venture went into effect 15 months ago, more than 60 employees have left the Everett location, not including those who have retired, said Milli Palmer, a licensed practical nurse and a member of the union’s executive board. The location has historically been home to about 200 employees, Palmer said.

Union members say staff have left largely because of unsustainable patient load requirements and fear of losing their licenses. Throughout Washington, employees have filed dozens of complaints with federal and state agencies regarding what they say are inadequate patient care, wage theft and unsafe practices.”
